In Lincoln, Nebraska, our chapter director Terry St.Hilaire reflected this summer on why he and his family were compelled to join the ACP in our mission of unmaking the truth about abortion:

"History today looks back in condemnation on the Germans during the Holocaust, even on the ordinary German citizen, and

We look back with the same condemnation on the people in this country who stood by during all the years that slavery was legal, or on those that fought against the civil rights struggle of the 60's. Abortion is the great injustice of our time, in all actuality a much greater atrocity than the Holocaust or slavery. I don't want to have future generations condemn me for not having done anything to end this atrocity.

"Nebraska may be a pretty red state, and largely pro-life, but the people there are just as complacent about the murder of countless babies happening every week right in our own neighborhoods. We have fallen asleep and need to be woken out of our comfortable lives and disturbed about the great tragedy happening in our midst."
